

HOW TO READ A TIMETABLE

Each timetable contains a map of the route. Many maps show landmarks, cross streets and transfer routes. To make your ride easier, be sure to study the timetable ahead of time and call Port Authority Customer Service at 412.442.2000 with any questions.

1. Look for the day of the week you wish to travel (weekday, Saturday, Sunday or holiday).
2. Look under the heading showing the direction you wish to go.
3. The headings over each column of times are timepoints and correspond to the stars in the route map. These are major intersections or landmarks along the route. Find your particular stop among the timepoints. If your particular stop is not a timepoint, look for the timepoint before your stop.
4. Read down the column under the timepoint to find the most convenient time the bus or T will arrive at your stop. Make sure you get to the stop a few minutes early.
5. Follow the times listed across the row, from left to right, until you reach your destination point to find your arrival time.
6. Make certain that a time is shown at your destination point. Some routes have trips that vary from the regular route at certain times and do not serve all the listed timepoints.
7. If a symbol or letter appears beside a time, check the timetable notes for further information.

GETTING FROM POINT A TO POINT B BY BUS OR T.

Whether you're new in town or you'd just like to know the fundamentals of getting around by bus and T, this handy brochure can have you up and riding in no time. Flip through it now, and take it with you any time you choose the convenience and savings of public transportation.

GET ROLLING: SIX THINGS YOU SHOULD KNOW BEFORE YOU GO.

1. Consult the appropriate Port Authority schedule and get to your stop a few minutes early just in case. You click your trip by going to our website, PortAuthority.org, and using our new online **Trip Planner** to find the route that gives you the fastest trip, the shortest walking distance, or the fewest transfers. Trip Planner is quick and easy, it's packed with useful information, and best of all it's easy to use.
2. Check the lighted sign on the front of the vehicle above the windshield for the route number and letter. If you're not sure it's the right one, just ask the operator before you board.
3. **Pay as you board** when you're going **toward Downtown. Pay as you leave** the bus or T on your way **away from Downtown.**
4. Put bills, coins, tickets in the fare box OR show your monthly or weekly pass to the operator or fare booth attendant. They can't give you change, so remember to have exact change. You can buy a transfer, which is good for three hours in any direction you are traveling within a single zone.
5. Take a seat and watch for your stop.
6. At least a block before your stop, pull the yellow cord above the window to alert the operator. When arriving Downtown, you can exit through any door. Everywhere else, leave through the front door.

ZONED IN.

Port Authority uses a five-zone system with four different fares based on the distance you're traveling from Downtown Pittsburgh. The fare increases as you cross into outlying zones. Two of the zones are within the Downtown area, and one of those is free.

FREE-FARE ZONE

The T is free anytime within the Golden Triangle (between Gateway Center, Wood Street, Steel Plaza, Penn Station and First Avenue). The bus is free within the Golden Triangle as far as Ross Street or 11th Street until 7 pm. After that, the fare is \$1.50.

DOWNTOWNER ZONE

\$1.50 between Downtown, Station Square, Allegheny Center, Allegheny General Hospital, Mercy Hospital, Duquesne University, PNC Park, Heinz Field, Mellon Arena and the Strip District.

ZONE 1

\$2.00 throughout the City of Pittsburgh and parts of the closer suburbs.

ZONE 2

\$2.60 from the Zone 1 boundary to the Allegheny County border.

ZONE 3

\$3.25 everywhere Port Authority buses serve beyond Allegheny County.

RUSH HOUR T FEE

PEAK FARE

Pay an additional .50¢ on weekdays when paying by cash and traveling inbound between 6-9 AM and outbound between 4-6:30 PM.

MINDING YOUR T's AND Q's.

Please follow these simple rules. It'll help make everyone's ride more comfortable.

- No smoking on Port Authority vehicles or at T stations; it could cost you a fine and ejection.
- No eating or drinking on Port Authority vehicles or T station platforms.
- Radios are not permitted without headphones.
- Please always step to the rear of the vehicle.
- Don't take up more than one seat if the vehicle is crowded.
- Port Authority welcomes you and your baby. However, in the interest of passenger safety, please hold the baby on your lap. Please fold your stroller up and try to keep it out of the way of other passengers.
- Shirt and shoes are required.
- If you must use your cell phone, please speak softly so as not to disturb other passengers.
